Background: following the fall of Saigon on 30/4/1975, about 2 millions of Vietnamese have escaped to settle in the Western world. Almost 500,000 have perished at sea or jungles on their way to freedom.

The Vietnamese Community in WA was established in 1978 supporting mainly refugees or new arrivals of its own heritage.

The Boat People Monument of Gratitude was built on William St Perth in 2013 as our gratitude to all who embraced us into this multicultural Australia.

The Koondoola Peace Park was completed in April 2018 to commemorate the Vietnam war where Australian soldiers fought alongside with Vietnamese to defend the Republic of South Vietnam against communists' invasion. Communists continued to invade our democratic South dishonouring their own signature in the Cease Fire Paris Accord 1973.

We call the 30th of April "The Black April" day.
